



## KID'S CLUB, HAITI

### \$25 can provide:

- › One week of Vacation Bible School with meals for three children.
- › One month of weekly meals and the gospel for eight children.

### \$50 can provide:

- › One week of Vacation Bible School with meals for six children.
- › One month of weekly meals and the Gospel for 17 children.

### \$75 can provide:

- › Safe drinking water to a family in our program.

### WHY VERNET

Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere, and over the last decade, natural disasters have left millions of families displaced and countless children as orphans. One of the hardest-hit areas is Vernet, a small community located just outside Les Cayes in southern Haiti. It is home to approximately 3,000 people, some of whom are native to Vernet, and others who fled to the community seeking relief from the destruction of Hurricane Matthew in 2016.



Children in this region suffer from polluted water, extreme malnutrition, no medical care, and difficult access to education. Extreme poverty has led to more than 400,000 Haitian children nationwide becoming trapped in a form of domestic slavery known as 'restavek,' which means 'to stay with'. They may live with relatives, friends, or even strangers and are often mistreated and forced to work in the home, usually at the expense of their educations. These restavek children are vulnerable to many forms of abuse.

### OUR PROGRAM | KID'S CLUB

Our program works hand in hand with the local Baptist church to serve the most vulnerable children in the community. We provide children with nutritious meals, financial assistance for school tuition, access to medical evaluations, vocational training and spiritual guidance. We also support families through disaster recovery, food packages, and homebuilding. All of these services aim to help families prevent more children from entering the restavek system. Currently, we are collaborating with a partner organization dedicated to protecting restavek children from abusive situations. Additionally, we are considering plans to construct a community center and establish a safe water program.
